# STRATHRORY WIND FARM REDESIGN APPLICATION

# 11TH JULY 2022 7.30PM ARDROSS COMMUNITY HALL OPEN TO ALL

EnergieKontor have submitted a redesign of the Strathrory Wind Farm for a total of 7 turbines; 5 of which will be up to 180m high, the remaining 2 up to 149.9m claiming that the existing consent for turbines of 149.9m is not economic.

The site is the same as their previous consent just north of the Strathy Road. It will be visible to many in Ardross and 5 of the turbines will be permanently lit with aviation lights.

The Ardross Community Council is keen to hear the views of the Ardross community before making a representation to the Highland Council, who are the delegated decision makers in this process. The Community Council is therefore holding a public meeting to hear people's views on the Application. So please do come along. The documents for the Application will be available in hard copy for viewing and there will be a very short presentation about the application and its possible impact.



# Latest Ardross Church (Ark)Update

There is to be a local wedding in Ardross Church (Ark) at the beginning of July and it is understood that the reception will be held in Ardross Hall. Isn't it good that a small place like Ardross can offer such joined up facilities!

Funding for repairs and upkeep of this historical listed community building is still a paramount issue; the Ardross Community Council were correct (WOIA -68) in that we have approached them for funding of repairs. The building is totally independent of the Church of Scotland and the Free Church of Scotland and no funding has been received from either of these denominations since before Covid.

Ardross Community has recently benefitted from monies received from the recent filming in The Ark; we are now in a position to undertake fencing repairs and make a start on stain glass window repairs.

In regard to the new sign; the trustees are **very** happy for the old sign to be re installed if requested for any specific function. The trustees intend for the building to be all inclusive and are prepared to satisfy all reasonable requests wherever possible. The Ark name was derived from 'Ardross Kirk / Church'.

The Ardross Community Council were incorrect in stating that the church building has 8 trustees, (WOIA-68) there are only six trustees not eight trustees as stated; the trust document does however allow for a total of up to eight trustees.

In relation to trustees the board is presently looking for a treasurer and if anyone in Ardross would wish to take on this role please contact me.

# Home fire safety

# Carbon Monoxide, fire and smoke alarms

The Scottish Government introduced new standards for carbon monoxide, fire and smoke alarms in all homes from 1st February 2022. This new legislation means that the standard which currently applies to private rented property and new-builds will be extended to all homes in Scotland.

# From February 2022 every home must have:

- \*\*a smoke alarm in the living room and in circulation spaces such as hallways and landings
- \*\*a heat alarm in every kitchen
- \*\*all alarms ceiling mounted and interlinked
- \*\*a carbon monoxide alarm where there are fixed combustion appliances such as boilers and wood burners

It is important that we make sure all households in the Ardross Community Council area know about the new regulations and what each household must install in relation to carbon monoxide, fire and smoke alarms.

Ardross Community Council has agreed to contribute up to £200 from the Community Benefit to household's in the Ardross Community Council area who meet the criteria set out below, in order to help towards the cost of installing these alarms and smoke detectors. <u>Applications will be accepted up to 31.12.22</u>

#### Criteria to qualify:

Own or mortgaged property located in Ardross Community Council area Second home/residence located in Ardross Community Council area

# Excluded:

Private rented properties Tied properties Holiday lets/Air BnB properties

# ARDROSS COMMUNITY COUNCIL...NEWS IMPORTANT COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS OF MEETING

The Ardross Community Council is holding a Public Meeting on the 11th July 2022 at 7.30 pm, at the Ardross Community Hall to discuss a new application by EnergieKontor to erect seven wind turbines 5 at maximum blade tip height 180m (which will require lighting). And 2 no higher than 149.9m. There are further details elsewhere in the Newsletter.

#### COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS

Since our last meeting two community councillors have resigned from the Community Council. The Community Council has yet to decide whether to try to fill these places by co-option for instance. If you are interested in the work of the Community Council please do come along to our meetings to see what is involved.

At our AGM in June the following Office Bearers were elected for another year: Chair: Peter Allen; Vice-Chair: Vacant; Secretary: John Edmondson; Treasurer: Alison Gordon.

Meetings have been started to try and develop a path between Stittenham and the Hall. Further meetings will be arranged to take this forward.

It is no longer a big secret, but the filming that has taken place over the last few months has now finished. This has made our roads more crowded than we have all been used to, not surprising given the amount of people working on the filming. The Community Council has intervened with the Production Team to try and alleviate some of these issues which mainly stem from the sheer volume of traffic and lack of familiarity of driving on single track roads.

#### ADDRESS CHURCH AKA ARK

It is hoped that talks with the Ardross Church Trustees will resume to try and resolve the outstanding issues outlined in the previous Newsletter. The Ardross Church Trustees have decided to rename the Ardross Church - ARK. This was not at our behest and we would have expected that such a proposal would have involved community consultation before going ahead.

#### IMPORTANT NEWS ABOUT COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Community Council will now be holding their meetings in the Ardross Community Hall. All are welcome. We are hoping to run our future meetings as a blended meeting. However it has proved difficult to fully involve those who wish to join remotely; comments have to be made via Chat for instance. #### **ROADS**

Quite a lot pot holes have been repaired on our local roads since our last Newsletter, using a new type of machine, but there still are some dangerous pot holes, we try and report these when we can, but rely on you to report them.

You can report pot holes using the Highland Council website, but it is cumbersome and seems to be designed to discourage reporting. There is an alternative way of reporting these potholes which is a lot easier

and seems to get results. So if you come across a pothole that you think needs repairing please report it. Remember once a pothole has been reported the Highland Council becomes liable for any damage caused by these potholes to vehicles.

Several of the bridges in Ardross are in a poor state of repair. Particularly the bridge near Lealty on the Boath Road and the bridge at Dublin.

#### **ENERGY GRANT**

This is a one off grant for £100 towards energy costs, this is open to eligible households until the end of December 2022. Details elsewhere in the Newsletter.

#### ARDROSS FIRE SAFETY GRANT

New regulations require that various smoke/heat/CO alarms are fitted into residential homes before February 2022. This has had a good take up. The Community Council has decided to keep the fund open for a while yet so there is still time to apply for a grant. To help householders meet these new regulations the Ardross Community Council are offering £200 towards the cost of the installation. #### PLANNING & WIND FARMS

#### Wind Farms

EnergieKontor have applied for a redesign of the Strathrory Windfarm comprising of 5 turbines up to 180m and 2 up to 149.9m. We are due to consider this at a Public Meeting on the 11th July 2022 7.30pm. Details elsewhere in the Newsletter.

EnergieKontor have also asked for a Condition to be changed for their existing consent. This is for the site entrance on the B9176. The Ardross Community Council were concerned that the sight lines were not sufficient the entrance being on a corner and have asked for further assurances on the matter.

#### **Planning**

A battery storage facility is at pre-application stage. The Applicant has just sent us notice that there will be a Public Meeting at Ardross Community Hall between 3pm and 7pm on the 5th July 2022. Please do go along. We are currently considering an extension to a house on the Strathy Road and a new entrance onto the Struie Road just north of Stittenham.

We have had no comment on an extension for a house at Glaick.

#### COMMUNITY BENEFIT

#### Recent Grants and getting an Award

The Community Council funds the Newsletter and makes a regular annual payment to the Ardross Primary School for organised trips, which was increased this year by 50%. We also fund electricity payments to eligible households. We have also helped Ardross Pipe Band purchase a new bass drum.

We are making grants available to households to help them comply with new Fire Legislation to install CO/Heat/Smoke Alarms, please see elsewhere in this Newsletter for the conditions of the grant and whether you will be eligible.

We are also making a one of payment of £100 per household towards energy costs. This grant will remain open for applications until 31.12.22, please see elsewhere in this Newsletter for the conditions of the grant and whether you will be eligible.

Between April 1st 2021 and 30th March 2022 the Community Council have distributed £26,784 of Community Benefit to eligible projects. Since April 1st 2022 the Community Council have distributed £12,193 of Community Benefit to eligible projects.
